Dear Town of Mentor residents

The first and most important concern is the health and safety of our residents and your families.

The world health organization made the decision to declare this a pandemic in relation to the Coronavirus (Covid-19). As a result, many Government and private organizations are ramping up their efforts to slow the spread of the virus.

- **Preparing for COVID-19** - Out of the abundance of caution we are implementing measures to prevent the spread of Covid-19 and protect you and the town employees from contracting the virus as we prepare ourselves for the seemingly inevitable time when it enters our community.
- **Keeping things Clean** - This week I asked the town clerk to keep things wiped down in the office door knobs desk, tables in the office. Linda will also have the cleaning lady wipe down all the tables in the hall.
- **Town Meetings** - The Governor has stated that there is a ban on more than ten people in one spot. - **Updates** - Things are changing every day and I have been in contact with Jon Ross from the Clark County Emergency Management Office he has been keeping townships up to date on the changes through E-mail and I will try to keep you up to date on town business.
